2021-2022 Shooting Team

Welcome! We are so excited about your interest in the Spring Branch FFA Clay Crushers shooting team for the 2021-2022 year. This is our 6th year as a shooting team through Spring Branch FFA and we are excited to watch our team grow and develop into a competitive team.

Here are a few things you need to know when signing up...

- 1. Team dues are \$150 which includes your team shirt and shooting vest (for new shooters). You also have the option of bringing in t-shirt sponsors with a \$250+ donation instead of you dues. (see t-shirt sponsorship form)
- You are required to shoot in at least 4-6 tournaments throughout the year. To shoot in the majors you must shoot in a qualifying shoot in the fall. Our first shoot will be September 18, 2021 at Texas Premier Sporting Arms in Sealy.
- 3. Tournament costs range from \$50-\$125 to register.
- 4. Spring Branch FFA will cover the cost of <u>some</u> of our tournament registration costs, training and other team expenses.
- 5. You will be responsible for any travel expenses. There are only two out of town tournaments that we participate in located in San Antonio.
- 6. Register as an athlete on our team with the Scholastic Clay Target Program (SCTP).

- 7. We will also compete in NSCA tournaments and you will need to join NSCA and get a shooter number. You can enroll in NSCA by going to nsca.nssa-nsca.org (click on "members button" and hit sign-up/renew.)
- 8. There is also a possibility that we will register as a 4H team as well in order to participate in those tournaments as well.
- Tournament schedules change constantly and there will be changes as the year goes along. The major tournament dates are set but local tournaments are usually only set out a couple of months and can change.
- 10. Iclays and winscoreonline are good website sources of upcoming tournaments.
- 11. If you have questions regarding guns, ear and eye protection etc. I will be glad to give you the information I have.
- 12. You will be responsible for your own ammunition and gun. Ammunition has been difficult to obtain over the last year and I would suggest buying in bulk when you see it and keeping a supply on hand.
